


Results/Findings: Facility Level

■Baseline ■Endline








Results/Findings: Community Level

Conclusions



- Changes in attitudes and beliefs among service providers helped strengthen SGBV treatment and support response for survivors.
- Psychosocial support remains a challenge for providers, particularly in facilities with low human resource capacity.
- In addition to strengthening technical capacity for treating SGBV survivors, increasing awareness and sensitization is key to successfully addressing SGBV issues.
- Stakeholders are committed to continuing this important work after the BRAVI project ends.


























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
